Covid restrictions in church

Following consultation with the PCC we have agreed that the following restrictions will operate in church until the next government review which is set for August 16th but may come sooner.

- Please continue to use the sign in sheet or QR code on entering church.
- Also please use hand sanitiser on entering, leaving and at communion.
- Please continue to wear a mask in church.
- The seating in the nave will be spaced at 1.25m. Some notices will be
 available for you to put on chairs either side to maintain a personal bubble
 if you so wish, coats and bags will do just as well. The side aisle seating
 will stay at 2m distance for those who would prefer it.
- Once the service starts please remain in your seat unless you have a role to perform or until your turn to go forward for communion.
- Communion will continue to be in one kind only.
- The choir will continue to sit in the chancel and sing without masks. The
 only restriction on numbers will be down to what its members are content
 with in terms of social distancing.
- The congregation can join in with singing but should wear masks
- Doors and windows remain open during services to improve ventilation.
- Brief conversations inside church and unrestricted mingling outside.
- Refreshments will not be served; we will need more help with the rota before we can start that!

Linton Village Quiz. Thank you to all those who entered. We had 17 copies returned with several very nearly correct. The level of detail and accuracy of answers was impressive and three people have been awarded small prizes. We are grateful to Boswells, Nourish organic shop and Sweet Talk News who sold copies. £212 has been raised for church funds. St Mary's Events Committee.

The Churchyard is a beautiful and much loved area, and as with many churchyards, a haven for wildlife. A survey of the flora carried out recently listed 38 species of wild flowers. Diana Cook, from the local Wildlife Trust, came on a recent visit to meet Maggie, members of the Monday Gang who volunteer to maintain it, and other interested parties, to discuss the possibility of applying for a Conservation Churchyard Award. A small group will be needed to oversee the work needed to apply for the Award; any volunteers would be very welcome! Discussions are taking place about a management plan for grass cutting to encourage flowering in the different seasons. It is also hoped to install swift boxes in the tower for these iconic birds, now in decline. This is an exciting opportunity to celebrate the wealth of wildlife we have in the centre of our village, and to make it more widely known to all walking through the churchyard.

The Peace Garden behind the south wall of the churchyard and next to the Pavilion, has been created within the past few years as a Community Garden, a joint project with Linton Parish Council and members of our local community. It has now been registered with The Quiet Garden Movement, which nurtures low cost, accessible, outdoor space for prayer, contemplation, rest and inspiration. Begun in 1992, there are now over 300 gardens worldwide, in a variety of settings including private homes, churches, hospitals and schools. The Peace Garden is already a well used and treasured space within our own village community, and now, as part of The Quiet Garden Movement, we can look forward to sharing it with visitors from further afield.
